My dear parishioners,

As mentioned in my last letter, today I will be writing about the importance of silence. In January 1998, when I was still a seminarian, I made a 33-day silent retreat at a Trappist monastery in Berryville, Virginia. I was given the privilege of living in community with the monks. Part of my stay required that I did work each morning for the monks which I did by painting their refectory (dining hall), cleaning in the fruitcake bakery and other tasks. I joined them for prayer and I had a lot of free time for private prayer, spiritual reading and journaling. The one aspect that sticks out for me about that time more than anything else was the silence. The only time I spoke was for the responses at Mass, to receive instructions for work and to ask an important question. I had become so used with the silence, one day I stopped in their gift shop to look at something, but I had to run out because two people were talking and it was too much noise for me. When I made the 6-hour drive back to NY, I could not turn on the radio, I just preferred the silence. It was a few months before I put the radio back on.

The silence became a gift. I was able to quiet other distractions and hear what the Lord was saying to me. In the almost twenty-five years since that retreat, the world has vastly changed. We have more noise, especially due to technology. We have so many more distractions and many people have become afraid of silence. I have visited homes where people keep the television on all day, even when no one is watching it. I have seen people get antsy with the silence. I myself struggle sometimes at first, with the constant checking of the phone. Seven young people from our parish went to LEAD at Franciscan University back in July. Almost every single one of them told me their favorite part was when they had enforced silence. They had no phones, no other electronic devices to keep them occupied and they had to refrain from talking. Silence is a gift, especially in a crazy world.

With our adoration chapel going perpetual (24/7), I want it to be an oasis of silence. There will be times when certain groups will have vocal prayer in the chapel, but the overwhelming amount of the time will be in silence. I want you to have a refuge where you can be alone with the Lord and just listen to Him. There is a beautiful story from St. John Vianney, who saw a farmer come each day and sit in the church for a time and gaze upon the Lord in the tabernacle. St. John Vianney asked the man one day what he said to the Lord each day. The man replied, "I look at the good Lord and He looks at me." That is all he did was just sit in silence gaze upon our Lord. I invite you to take the opportunity and gaze upon the Lord in our beautiful tabernacle/monstrance and let Him gaze upon you. Do not be afraid to sit in silence, do not think you have to do something, just be. There is a beautiful line from Psalm 46:10 "Be still and know that I am God." I invite you to come to the chapel and be still and know our God.

Mis queridos feligreses,

Como les mencioné en mi última carta, hoy les escribiré acerca de la importancia del silencio. En enero de 1998, cuando todavía era un seminarista, hice un retiro de silencio de 33 días en un monasterio Trapense en Berryville, Virginia. Me dieron el privilegio de vivir en comunidad con los monjes. Parte de mi estadía requería que trabajara para los monjes cada mañana lo cual hice pintando su refectorio (comedor), limpiando en la panadería de pastel de frutas y otras tareas. Me unía a ellos para orar y tenía bastante tiempo libre para oración privada, lectura espiritual y escribir en mi diario. El único aspecto que me llamó la atención de esa época más que cualquier otra cosa fue el silencio. El único tiempo que hablé fue para responder en Misa, para recibir instrucciones del trabajo y preguntar algo importante. Me había acostumbrado tanto al silencio, que un día me detuve en su tienda de regalos para ver algo, pero tuve que salir corriendo porque dos personas estaban hablando y era demasiado ruido para mí. Cuando manejé las 6 horas de regreso a NY, no pude prender el radio, simplemente preferí el silencio. Pasaron unos meses antes de que volviera a prender el radio.

El silencio se convirtió en un regalo. Me fue posible callar otras distracciones y escuchar lo que el Señor me estaba diciendo. En casi veinticinco años después de ese retiro, el mundo ha cambiado enormemente. Tenemos más ruido, especialmente debido a la tecnología. Tenemos muchas más distracciones y mucha gente le tiene miedo al silencio. He visitado hogares donde las personas mantienen la televisión prendida todo el día, aún cuando nadie la está mirando. He visto personas inquietarse con el silencio. Yo mismo luché algunas veces al principio, revisando constantemente el teléfono. Siete jóvenes de nuestra parroquia fueron en julio a LEAD (siglas en inglés) en la Universidad Franciscana. Casi todos me dijeron que su parte favorita era cuando habían impuesto el silencio. No tenían teléfonos, ni otros aparatos electrónicos para mantenerlos ocupados y tenían que abstenerse de hablar. El silencio es un regalo, especialmente en un mundo loco.

Con nuestra capilla siendo perpetua (24/7), quiero que sea un oasis de silencio. Habrá momentos cuando ciertos grupos tendrán oración vocal en la capilla, pero la mayor parte del tiempo será en silencio. Quiero que tengan un refugio donde puedan estar solos con el Señor y solamente escucharlo. Hay una hermosa historia de San Juan Vianney, que vio a un agricultor venir todos los días y sentarse en la iglesia por un tiempo y contemplar al Señor en el tabernáculo. San Juan Vianney le preguntó al hombre un día qué le decía al Señor todos los días. El hombre le contestó, "Yo miro al buen Señor y El me mira". Eso era todo lo que él hacía, simplemente sentado en silencio contemplaba a nuestro Señor. Los invito a que se den la oportunidad de contemplar al Señor en nuestro hermoso tabernáculo/custodia y déjen que El los mire. No tengan miedo de sentarse en silencio, no piensen que tienen que hacer algo, solo sé. Hay una hermosa frase del Salmo 46,10 "¡Ríndanse! ¡Reconozcan que yo soy Dios!". Los invito a venir a la capilla y ríndanse y conozcan a nuestro Dios. Que Dios les bendiga,

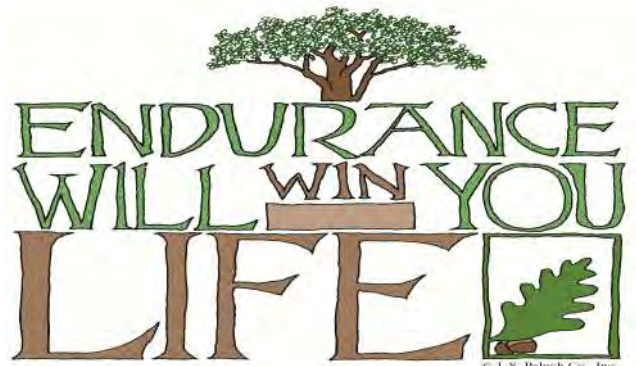

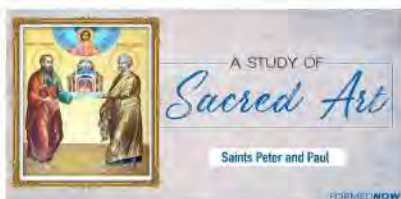
Adoración

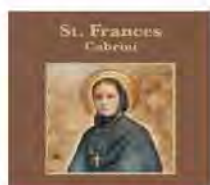




St. Frances Cabrini


